Heptonstall and its Church by Graptolite (some similarities to R14 which says Graptolite was the nom-de-plume of Mr Ogden and gives the date as around 1882.) (mentions ancient gravestone in the centre of the ruins with a cross, rudely outlined, and no inscription is seen. It is of rough pebbly grit, quite of a different character to any to be found in other churches in the Parish. Watson refers to an "antient gravestone, the inscription round which is worn out, but a Calvary cross is still visible thereon." Refers to Rev Joshua Fawcett's book "Churches of York" published a lecture in 1848 on the church which is given in detail. Mentions many family names and local places in 1500-1700s.e.g. Sutcliffes, Cockcrofts - explains how the Cockcrofts came to have Mayroyd Estate when Dr Dean Sutcliffe's father died in 1581, he was Archdeacon of Taunton and he conveyed the estate to his two porters Adam and Solomon and through the former it was ultimately transferred to the Cockcroft Family.(bottom of p2). Also Rigges, Saltonstalls, Greenwoods, Wall.Stoodley Estates. Mentions Webber, Webster, Spinner, Spinster were names given to male and female weavers and spinners (p9). Horsfalls (p11). Draper, Broadbottom, Hoohole, Fallingroyd, Lee, Weetings. Akroyd.Gamwell Sutcliffe and Sutcliffe family (p16).Stansfield Hall, Saville, Widdops, Drapers, Broadbottom (Brodebotham) (p17) Fallandrode (Fallingroyd) (p18) Stansfeld family.
